Near East

Uttu – Mesopotamian goddess Weaving – often depicted as a spider

God commanding a spider to save a holy believer Islamic oral tradition – a spider wove a web across a cave opening when Muhammad was hiding from soldiers that were pursuing him

Jewish oral tradition – a spider wove a web across a cave opening when David was being chased by King Saul



Ancient Greece / Rome

Weaving competition between Athena and Arachne Arachne was a human woman who thought that she was a better weaver even than the goddess Athena, so she challenged her.

> Athena's tapestry – the gods are virtuous Arachne's tapestry – the gods are unethical, abusive, unjust, childish

Athena cursed her to live with extreme guilt & Arachne hung herself

Athena brought her back to life as a spider

Africa


Kwaku Ananse – Anansi of the Akan-Ashanti people

Trickster god – known to be very cunning

Many Spider tales deal with morality

Hausa people – spiders are the most cunning of all animals & the king of stories




The Americas

Polish folklore

An Inspiration for Robert the Bruce (Scotland)

Tarantella – Southern Italy's "Dance of the Spider"

15th century – one of the most beloved folk dances of Italy

Started as a "cure" for tarantism – when folks get bit by a venomous spider, they would dance wildly to expel venom

Now commonly danced at weddings by couples

- Boston Children's Hospital


Arachnophobia is one of the most common fears

Ways to Overcome Fears: Increase awareness and appreciation of insects


Counter negative perceptions of insects.



Diversity of Spiders

132 families 50,000 species (described so far)

"We would not be surprised if true spider diversity, in the early 21st century, described and undescribed, exceeded 200,000 species."



Medically Important Spiders

Widows - Latrodectus spp.

Causes release of neurotransmitters and prevents resorption

Symptoms of bite: pain (local, radiating, or specific to back, chest, and abdomen), sweating, and less commonly fever, hypertension, paralysis, cardiac effects, renal failure




Medically Important Spiders

Brown Recluse - Loxosceles reclusa

Symptoms of bite: mild reddening to large necrotic ulcers; in rare cases (<1%) destroys red blood cells, causes intra-vascular coagulation, renal failure, and death in 12-30 hrs (mostly in children)

Most systemic effects chills/sweating and malaise
